Council Actions for January 9, January 17, and January 23, 2024 City Council Meetings

January 9 Council Meeting

- Accepted improvements associated with the South Tehama Water Main Extension Project.
- Approved resolution authorizing a contract with NEXGEN Utility Management for design of the Willows' Lift Station Rehabilitation Project.
- Approved Five-Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) for 2023-2027.
- Approved Development Impact Fee Report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023.

January 17 Council Meeting

• Approved Mid-Year Budget Review and recommended adjustments.

January 23 Council Meeting

- Awarded contract to APS Environmental Inc. for \$28,376 for Closed Circuit TV (CCTV) inspection of the City's sewer mains.
- Approved accepting a 10-foot wide Public Access and Utility Easement at 725
 South Tehama Street for development purposes.
- Approved contract amendment to Coastland's professional services agreement to provide design services to upgrade the Civic Center and Jensen Park with Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant doors and pathways.

Engineering Division

Library HVAC System Replacement

In an effort to ensure dependable climate control measures for library patrons, the library's HVAC system is scheduled to be replaced by March 2024 replacing three old HVAC units on the library roof. This is especially important as the library is one of the County's identified cold-hot safety centers for vulnerable members of our community who may need cooling during the hot summer months or warmth during the winter. This project is funded through a State grant and the City's library impact fees.


Sewer Lift Station Upgrades

The City contracted with Nexgen to design upgrades for the City's five sewer lift stations. The project kick-off meeting was held in January and staff is working with the consultant on a formal design. The project will ensure that the City's sewer infrastructure operates consistently and reliably. It will also provide upgraded communications at each of the lift stations so that they may be monitored remotely. The project is funded by a bond paid for by the City's Sewer Enterprise Fund.

Multi-Jurisdiction Hazard Mitigation Plan

The City is partnering with the City of Orland and Glenn County to complete an update to the Multi Jurisdiction Hazard Mitigation Plan (MJHMP). The MJHMP will identify natural hazards that may affect residents, their impacts, and the desired mitigation actions to address and minimize the risk and future losses from natural hazards such as flooding, severe storms, earthquakes, and wildland fires. Additionally, the MJHMP will also serve to meet key federal planning regulations that require local governments to

develop a Hazard Mitigation Plan as a condition for receiving certain types of nonemergency disaster assistance, including funding for hazard mitigation projects.

Flood Mitigation and Repairs

With recent heavy rains, Public Works staff have been kept busy cleaning out drainage inlets prior to, and during, rain events. To ensure personal and first responder safety, please be mindful of road closure barricades, adhere to sign postings, and avoid flooded road areas during and after storm events.

What to know about Flood Safety

- Develop and use a family emergency communication plan (include pets).
- Maintain emergency supplies ready for use at home, at work, and in the car.
- Check on neighbors to make sure they are safe.
- Be aware of what to do before, during, and after a flooding event.
- Listen to and follow the directions of local officials on the radio, TV or social media.
- Evacuate when advised by authorities or if you are in a flood or flash flood prone area.
- Be prepared to stay in location if you are on high ground above flooded areas. This may be your safest protection.
- Flood insurance takes 30 days to take effect, so purchase now for protection.

Contract Recreation Manager Recruitment is Underway



- Lowers stress.






FINANCE



2023 Firefighter of the Year Special thank you and congratulations to *Firefighter Matt Lopez* who was selected as the 2023 Firefighter of the Year!


New Firefighter Volunteers



The Willows Library is excited to announce two popular library services which have been awarded funding for the 2024 calendar year:


Lunch with the Library

New Materials for Digital Overdrive/Libby Application Collection






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
