

Prior to re-joining the County, Joe was a Program Analyst in the City of Sacramento's Department of Utilities from 2017 to 2019. Before working in Sacramento, he also worked for Glenn County in the Planning and Public Works Departments as an Administrative Analyst II/III. Joe holds a Master of Public Administration from American Public University and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminal Justice from California State University, Chico.

On November 13, Joanne Moore will start as the City's new Accounting Manager. Council Actions for September 12, October 4, October 10, and October 24 City Council Meetings

September 12 Council Meeting

- Proclamations Awards of Appreciation to Rural District Fire Chief Alex Parisio,
 Firefighter Riley Eck and Fire Engineer John Peterich, and Awarded a
 Commendation for Valor to Fire Captain Kyle Enos.
- Amended FY 2023-2024 Budget rescinding approval of the design contract for repairs to the City Swimming Pool and the full-time Recreation Director.
- Approved Bid award of contract Planning Services to LACO Associates.
- Approved Resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute an agreement with North State Air Conditioning for \$15,000 to replace one of the HVAC units on the roof of City Hall.

October 4 Council Meeting

October 10 Council Meeting

- Authorized Library Director, or designee, to sign the agreement with the Health and Human Services Agency for the purpose of the Willows Library partnering with Glenn County HHSA to provide the citizens of Glenn County with public health education, including timely access to COVID-19 mitigation, treatment, and prevention.
- Approved Resolution declaring the City's election to adopt the informal bidding

procedures and other provisions of the California Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act (ACT).

- Appointed Sherry Brott to the Planning Commission
- First Reading Approved General Plan Update, North Valley Indian Health Rezone to re-designate five parcels from office and professional to general commercial.
- Approved Resolution authorizing execution of an agreement with NorCal Pipeline Services for 13,210 to perform a Closed Circuit TV (CCTV) Inspection of City Sewer Mains.
- Approved Resolution declaring a fiscal emergency, and authorizing the placement of a 1% sales tax measure on the March 2024 election ballot.
- Appointed Councilmember Hutson as an alternate to the Regional Transit Committee and the Library Board Committee, and appointed Mayor Thomas to the Public Safety Committee.

October 24 Council Meeting

- Second Reading Approved Opt-in to the California Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act (ACT).
- Approved New sewage pumps for Cherry Street Lift Station contingent upon Northeast Willows Community Service District Approval.
- Approved City Hall HVAC Unit Replacment
- Approved Bid process for city owned land (e.g., rice fields) with extraction of 1.5
 acres for future solar array installation to offset wastewater treatment plant
 electrical expenses.
- Approved Award bid to Willdan to update Master Fee Schedule.
- Second Reading Approved General Plan Update, North Valley Indian Health Rezone to re-designate five parcels from office and professional to general commercial.
- Approved Temporary Law Enforcement Agreement with the Glenn County Sheriff's Office in the amount of \$1,285,306 from July 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023.
- Approved 1% Sales Tax Measure Ordinance to place on the March 2024 ballot.
- Appointed Councilmember Gary Hansen was appointed to the County's Drought Management Committee.

Northern Valley Indian Health Rezone Project

At the October 10, 2023 City Council meeting, a public hearing was held to consider rezoning five parcels of, as well as General Plan Amendment, Northern Valley Indian Health. Following the hearing, the Council approved the first reading of a resolution approving the parcel rezones and the General



Plan amendment, which was presented again for final approval at the October 24, 2023 City Council meeting.

Jack in the box

The City's Planning Division is awaiting the fifth round of revised plans from Jack in the Box before approvals to move forward with the project.

Hampton Inn

The Hampton Inn project, including Design Review, was approved by the Planning Commission (PC). Currently, City staff await the applicant's approved Conditions of Approval and plan submission for final approval.

Sundial Collective (Cannabis)

The Collective's Use Permit deadline was recently extended. City await applicant's plan submission, including proposed temporary structure.

Red 88 Noodle House

Planning Commission reviewed and approved Design Review process on October 18. Project moving forward.

Super 8 Motel

Planning Commission approved color scheme. Project moving forward.

Cal Water Main Connection

The City is very pleased to announce that the water main connection from the Cal Water system to the City owned water wells in South Willows is complete. As a result, the City is poised to transfer responsibility of water purveying services, for its three customers that receive water services from the City, to Cal Water. The transfer of this city resource to Cal Water will eliminate the city's tremendous responsibility and liability of managing a highly regulated resource - potable water (e.g., future water treatment for


Chrome 6), as well as a Water Enterprise Fund that operates at a structural deficit and has for several years, relying on General Fund resources to balance its budget.

With one less utility to construct, the new water main connection will also help promote new development and investment in South Willows.






Soccer Season is in Full Swing!




Riley Eck completed his probationary period and was sworn in as a volunteer firefighter.


