Non-Profit Stabilization Grant

Program Guidelines

Third round of funding approved November 7, 2023

To mitigate the impacts from the COVID-19 pandemic, the County of Glenn is administering a business stabilization grant program for non-profit organizations. This program will assist non-profit entities recovering from economic hardships brought on by the pandemic. Eligible entities may be awarded up to \$15,000 in funding.

Program Requirements/Eligibility Criteria:

- ✓ Entity must be a non-profit with valid tax exempt status, in good standing with the Internal Revenue Service and California Franchise Tax Board
- ✓ Entity must serve Glenn County residents
- ✓ Entities who have previously received a business stabilization grant through Glenn County are not eligible for this round
- ✓ Entity must have suffered economic hardship due to the COVID-19 pandemic and provide supporting documentation
- ✓ Entity must supply a budget plan detailing how the funds will be spent

Program Details

- Applications will be accepted from December 1, 2023 – February 29, 2024
- All applications and grants will be evaluated and awarded via a first come, first serve basis
- There are no application fees or other related costs to apply for the program
- Applications can be accepted via email, fax, regular mail or in person at the Planning & Community Development Services Agency Office (see application for contact information)
- The program will be consistent with all State and Federal Equal Opportunity laws. No person or business will be excluded from participation in, denied the benefit of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity on the basis of their religion, religious affiliation, age, race, color, ancestry, national origin, sex, marital status, familial status, physical or mental disability, sexual orientation or other arbitrary cause
- Complete applications will be evaluated by a panel of Planning & Community Development Agency staff and said staff retains full discretion on award amounts as determined by the application documentation on a case-by-case basis
